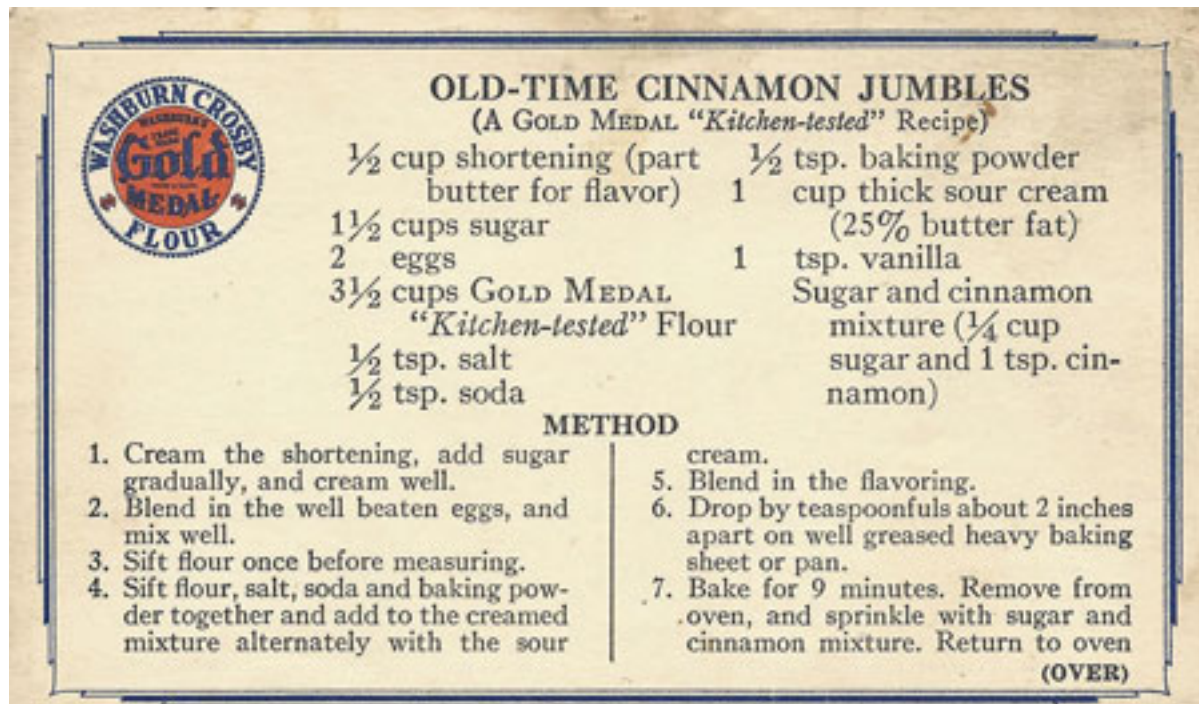


Chloe Ellefson walked from 1982 into 1870s

Gold Medal Flour Old-Time Cinnamon Jumbles Recipe

In *Tradition of Deceit*, Chloe bakes this popular Gold Medal Flour recipe from the 1930's, which she serves to her friend Ariel (p. 288). Here is the front of the original recipe card; the remaining instructions from the reverse side are listed below the card image. Enjoy!



...immediately to finish baking (1 to 3 minutes longer.) **TIME**—bake 10 to 12 minutes.
TEMPERATURE—425 F., hot oven. **AMOUNT**—5 dozen medium-sized cookies.
